#### <u>Attendance</u>

Attendance is a significant concern for all schools and is essential for the best educational outcomes. You must write a letter or email if you require to take leave during a school term. We understand that sometimes things are unavoidable and that things are more expensive during the school holidays. We suggest refraining from doing this if possible. What leave is deemed as 'unacceptable' by the Department is as follows:

- celebrating a birthday
- Going on a family holiday
- Visiting family and friends
- Has slept in or had a big weekend
- Looking after other children
- Has a sport or other recreational activities that the school has not approved
- Has an appointment such as haircut and minor check ups

#### Did you know, Its NOT OK to stay away!

The following chart highlights the impact of non-attendance over time. Viewed in this context, the implications of regular absenteeism are startling. The chart shows the cumulative effect of persistent non– attendance over the period from Pre-Primary to Year 12. Poor attendance makes it difficult for students to form peer relationships.

#### School Business Plan

During the school development days, our staff put the finishing touches to our new 2023-2025 Business Plan. This outlines the direction for the school for the next 3 years. It also makes clear the targets that will be measured each year and the improvement required.

#### Gates

A reminder that from the start of Week 6 Tuesday the 7th of March that parents will be required to allow students to walk onto the school grounds by themselves. This will mean that all students from Pre-Primary to Year Six will be asked to enter the school grounds by themselves to set themselves up for the school day. This is a skill for students in developing leadership skills and independence.

#### **School Start and Finnish Times**

The school gates will open at **8.25am** each morning, for a **8.40am** Lesson start. The school day finishes at **3pm** apart from **Wednesday for early close at 2.30pm**.

#### Assemblies 2023

There will be some changes to the structure of assemblies in terms of frequency, content and classes attending.

#### **Factors impacting on changes:**

- The number of students in the school, requires a split of student numbers attending assemblies.
- 2) The concern regarding ventilation and possible infection exposure to viruses.
- 3) The amount of time required by staff to prepare students for items at assemblies.

#### **Benefits Of School Assemblies**

- 1) They provide public speaking opportunities to students
- 2) Students develop a sense of community within the school.
- 3) Assemblies provide a setting requiring the self– discipline to listen and observe what is being presented in a vigilant manner.
- 4) Social discipline is taught in an assembly setting to observe quietly, to be polite and courteous to staff and other audience members. Students learn how and when to participate appropriately, be that clapping or signing along.
- 5) The assembly provides an opportunity to reinforce core values that our school has. It is another medium for character development.
